### Expanded Interest Area Ideas

**Travel Agency** – Transform an area of your classroom into a travel agency, using postcards, maps, travel magazines and brochures, posters, materials to purchase tickets, and more. Children may also wish to have materials to pack for their trip based on their destinations: small suitcases, hats, towels, coats, bathing suits, boots, flip-flops, etc. (Bon Voyage!, p. 34; Boarding Pass, Please, p. 36; Destinations, p. 37; Passports, p. 40; What's in the Bag?, p. 42; All Aboard, p. 43; Traveling Together, p. 56)

**Post Office** – Gather supplies such as boxes, envelopes, paper, bubble wrap, crayons, pencils, etc., to create a post office. You may also wish to create a classroom mail center for children to send letters/drawings to each other. (Postcard Art, p. 40; My Letter to You, p. 48; The Mail Is Here!, p. 48; Weighty Packages, p. 50; Shipping Center, p. 50; Traveling Mail, p. 51; Magnificent Mailbox, 52; Post Office Fun, p. 52)
